We've had a great deal of interest in the McPhillamys Project following the submission of our Amendment Report (changes and improvements to the project) and our Submissions Report (responses to the questions and issues raised during the public exhibition of the project, last year).

A lot of people have asked about job and business opportunities and we're happy to discuss the possibilities, though it will be some time (possibly mid-2021) before we have a decision on whether or not the project is approved.

In the meantime, feel free to send in your business or personal CV and we'll keep it on our register.

What happens next?

The Amendment Report will now be assessed by the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE) and they will make a recommendation (to approve or reject the project) to the NSW Independent Planning Commission (IPC).

As part of the assessment, DPIE staff have indicated they will visit Blayney to review the site and meet with local stakeholders. That visit is likely to be some time during October.

One of the changes to the project plan is the location of the site access point on the Mid Western Highway.

Following feedback from neighbours, residents of Kings Plains and Transport for NSW we have moved the entry point

further east (by approximately 1km) along the Highway.
