### Autumn planting

After a cool, wet summer the ground is now perfect for our next round of tree planting on site.

The first stage was completed by Skillset Land Works last week with 1,400 trees planted along existing corridors, to fill gaps caused by losses during the drought.

The next stage will take place over the coming weeks with a further 4,500 trees to be planted on a neighbouring property and our offset property Aziel, south of Blayney.

We'll also be giving away 2,000 native tube stock to our near neighbours around Kings Plains and Guyong Road so they can also take advantage of this great planting season.
