The McPhillamys Gold Project assessment process

Something which came up at our recent Community Consultative Committee meeting is the lengthy and complicated process for assessing major projects like McPhillamys, in NSW.

Why does it take so long? It's a question which is asked regularly in meetings and out in the community.

Whether you're for or against the project, the lack of certainty is both frustrating and disappointing. For our neighbours and nearby landowners, that uncertainty can also be very stressful.

We share that frustration and we're as keen as you are to get a decision—hopefully an approval so we can get on

with delivering the project and the many jobs and other benefits it will bring to Blayney and the Central West.

However, projects like McPhillamys are large and complicated and every aspect of our proposal is being examined and tested in great detail. Even though it takes years to get through, the benefit of that process is that it is very thorough. Nothing is left to chance, and nor should it be.

Where are we up to?

Our project team continues to do every thing we can to keep the process moving. And we are working with government agencies to meet the remaining requests for information required to finalise the assessment. Once that happens, the project will go the NSW Independent Planning Commission for a final decision.

Our team thanks all of you for your patience and we'll keep you up to date on our progress in future columns.
