Public hearings and McPhillamys

I mentioned in an earlier update that the McPhillamys Gold Project has been referred to the NSW Independent Planning Commission (IPC) for assessment.

Unfortunately, an ABC radio news story last week caused concern for a number of our neighbours when it reported that the IPC had been ordered to hold a public hearing on the project, despite the Coronavirus restrictions.

This story was not initiated by Regis Resources and we were very surprised by the report.

We were also concerned to hear that it had caused alarm to some of our neighbours and local residents.

Whilst the project has been referred to the IPC, I would like to stress that no date has been set for a public hearing and there is no suggestion that such a hearing would be held

in the near future. The assessment process has a long way to go before the IPC can review the McPhillamys proposal.

Given all the circumstances, we anticipate that the IPC will not be dealing with the McPhillamys Gold Project until the end of this year, at the earliest.

In the meantime we will continue to keep you advised of progress. And rest assured that community safety and well-being is our top priority.
