Response to Submissions

Work continues both on and offsite as we progress all aspects of the McPhillamys Gold Project. We are working through the Response to Submissions (RTS) and aiming to have this finalised around the middle of the year.

The RTS will include some changes, in response to feedback received during the exhibition of the Development Application (DA) and the associated Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Our key focus continues to be on minimising any impacts, especially for our neighbours.

Drill rig bore testing

On site, we are continuing our soil and water testing, including groundwater testing.

This includes a series of bore tests using a drill rig which you may have seen at different locations on McPhillamys over the past week.

These tests will continue until late May/early June.
