Rehabilitating after drilling

An important part of our work at McPhillamys is the protection, rehabilitation and improvement of the land which is owned by and impacted by the project.

This includes rehabilitation after activities like drilling and exploration; replacement and improvement of biodiversity areas; and longer term planning for rehabilitation of land which would be impacted by mining if the project is approved.

In line with best practice, our approach involves environmental and rehabilitation works from the start of a project.

A good local example is our tree planting program on McPhillamys site, creating corridors which will help to link biodiversity areas as well as providing visual screens.

We have also rehabilitated the land at Discovery Ridge, near Mandurama, where

Regis undertook drilling activities during 2017 and 2018.

It usually takes a few seasons for the land to come back and progress can vary a lot, depending on the amount of rain. But, the site is now recovering very well (see the photo below right) and the recent rain falls have really helped.
