Water use

An issue that comes up consistently when we talk to the community is whether McPhillamys will affect availability of local surface and groundwater.

McPhillamys will not use local water supplies for gold production. Instead, we'll be using excess mine water piped to site from Lithgow. During construction we'll use licensed groundwater from Regis-owned bores.

Local and downstream landowners will have the same access to river water and groundwater as they do now.

Water licencing

The McPhillamys site has been designed to divert clean water—that would normally flow across the mine site—around the site and into the Belubula River. This unused, diverted water - and some runoff water on

the site - must be licenced under the water licencing process in NSW. McPhillamys is working with government agencies to agree a water licencing pathway for diverted water and runoff.

Once a water licencing pathway is agreed, the Department of Planning and Environment will be able to refer McPhillamys to the Independent Planning Commission (IPC) for a final decision on the project.
