McPhillamys Project Update: next steps

Following the recent approval of the McPhillamys Project we've had a lot of questions about the next steps.

In particular we've had lots of inquiries about jobs and supplier opportunities from people in Blayney and the Central West.

We're really looking forward to the next phase but there are a few more steps to navigate before we start construction.

Firstly, we'll be studying the 120+ consent conditions and working on a variety of management plans which are

central to the mine's approval and operations.

The government approval will also enable Regis to develop a final feasibility study for the project.

These are the final steps prior to the Regis Board making a final investment decision on the project, expected in early 2024.

In the meantime, we are happy to take enquiries, receive CVs or business expressions of interest.
