Rehabilitating native bush and koala habitat

One of the important benefits of the McPhillamys Gold Project is the permanent preservation of koala habitat in the Blayney Shire, as a legacy of the project.

Regis owns the Aziel property near Blayney, which contains large areas of habitat suitable for Koalas including Box Gum Woodland.

Suitable areas of habitat on Aziel will be protected in perpetuity under a stewardship agreement.

Regis will also rehabilitate and replant historically cleared areas on the property.

Working with our local beekeepers

The trees on Aziel are also ideal for honey, so we were very pleased to support beekeepers David and Tracey Parker (Cottesbrook Honey) by hosting their hives there during 2023.

David and Tracey reported great results, producing premium Red Gum, Yellow Box and Apple Box honey which is now on sale at their produce stall in Kings Plains.

Their bees went on to work in Griffith (pollinating almonds) and Orange (pollinating apples and cherries).
